# Cootes Veterinary Clinic donates £500 to both St Peter & St James Hospice and Arundawn Dog Rescue

A Burgess Hill veterinary practice has donated a total of £1000 between two charities, St Peter & St James Hospice and Arundawn Dog Rescue.

The whole team at Cootes Vets got together to apply for a community grant, made available from the practice's parent company, IVC Evidensia. The team at the clinic wanted to support both charities, and were keen to do what they could to help.

St Peter & St James Hospice provides expert care to adults living with a life-limiting illness in our community and those close to them.

Arundawn Dog Rescue provides rescue, rehabilitation and rehoming for council pound strays who have served their obligatory 7 days and are facing euthanasia, through no fault of their own.

Emma Beckford, Practice Manager from Cootes Vets added: "Our team here, by the very nature of caring for animals, already play a really valuable and positive role in the community. We are thrilled that we've been able to win a community grant for both St Peter & St James Hospice and Arundawn Dog Rescue, as being able to donate to this cause and help them to continue their amazing work is important to our team here at Cootes Vets."
