To become a Student Veterinary Nurse, you will need to find a placement at both a training practice and a training college. The above course involves working in practice with day release to college. You are required to complete an on-line nursing progress log and will be assigned a Clinical Coach from within the Veterinary Practice. There are also examinations at the end of each year.

Veterinary Nursing Degree

Entry requirements:	Will vary between universities but generally a minimum 5 GCSES or equivalent at
	grade C, including English Language, Maths and a Science.
	A2 biology grade C (or equivalent)
	Two other subjects as A2 level (no more than one art/design subject)
Course length:	3 – 4 years including a 1-year work placement

A Career as a Veterinary Surgeon

Entry requirements: These will vary between universities but generally you will need an A level in Biology plus two more A levels ideally in Chemistry, Physics or Maths. The minimum grades required are two A's and a B, although some universities will ask for three A's.

Course length: 5-6 years.
