## Do you know that we can offer Cryosurgery with the use of our Cryopen?

Cryopen uses a fine jet of nitrous oxide delivered under high pressure to effectively freeze the affected area. This treatment method is extremely accurate, quick and effective, and with no stress. Pets are notorious for licking or pulling at wounds after surgery, which can cause infection, but as this procedure involves no cutting or bleeding, it minimises the risk of infection from those busy tongues and nibbling teeth.

Since anaesthesia is not necessary with cryosurgery, not only the time involved, but also the surgical risks are decreased. This is especially beneficial when working with an older pet whose liver, kidneys and heart may not be in the best of health. This method is used to remove smaller lesions on the face, nose, eyelids, ears, legs and feet.

Please speak to one our vets at the practice for further information, and whether this may be suitable for your pet. Wasp Stings Apples on the ground may have wasps inside feeding on the fruit. Our pets cannot resist snapping, pawing and chasing wasps, which can result in a nasty, painful sting! Swelling, particularly around the face or mouth, drooling, difficulty breathing or collapse, then do not delay in calling us, as some cats and dogs can be allergic to stings.

❖ Easily stand up tall on their hind legs ❖ Lie fully outstretched ❖ Make at least 3 consecutive hops ❖ Turn around unhindered


#### Online Appointments


