FIREWORK SAFETY

ITS THAT TIME OF YEAR WHEN LOTS OF PEOPLE ARE CELBRATING WITH FIREWORKS BOTH WITH ORGANISED AND PERSONAL DISPLAYS

HOW TO KEEP YOUR HORSE AS CALM AS POSSIBLE:

- Keep calm—horses sense anxiety and stress keep your mood low
- Know times and dates of fire work displays and speak to neighbours ask them to inform you if they are planning on their own display. Knowledge is key!
- Keep your horses in their normal routine to avoid further stress
- Fire safety—although it's rare to have rogue fireworks don't be caught out have a fire extinguisher to hand
- Use distractions—give plenty of forage, maybe some extra tasty treats like a hanging swede.
- · Check your horse regularly
- Radio—handy to have playing in the background as a distraction
