UK to EU Pet Travel Form

Please complete this form and return it to us well in advance of your travel to Europe.

What do you need to provide:

- 1. A document as a proof for a valid Rabies vaccination (Pet passport, Vaccination card)
- 2. Proof of Microchipping (if not already on our records)

Tapeworm treatment:

From Great Britain to EU listed tapeworm free counties:

If you are traveling to one of the following countries your dog must be treated for tapeworms by a UK registered veterinary surgeon. This must be nor more than 120 hours and no less than 24 hours before entry into one the following countries:

- 1. Northern Ireland
- 2. Malta
- 3. Ireland
- 4. Finland
- 5. Norway

If you are returning from a tapeworm free listed country you do not need a tapeworm treatment.

From EU to UK

If you are returning to the UK from your holiday your dog must be treated for tapeworm no less than 24hours and nor more then 120 hours before time of entry into the UK. Please take your AHC to a EU registered vet for this treatment to be administered.

Short trips:

If you are leaving Great Britain on a short trip returning within 120 hours the tapeworm treatment needs to be administered and certified by a veterinary surgeon in England, Wales or Scotland before you are leaving.
