

Laminitis – A Painful Condition

With the grass growing and the number of cases on the rise throughout the summer, we felt it was time to give you a laminitis update.

Laminitis is inflammation of the sensitive layers of the hoof, known as the 'laminae' resulting in pain, inflammation and, in some cases, permanent damage to the laminae. The laminae help hold the pedal bone in place. When they becomes permanently damaged there is a separation of the pedal bone from the laminae which results in sinking and rotation of the pedal bone. This is a very painful.

There are many causes of laminitis, the most common causes are:

- Carbohydrate overload Excess hard feed and/or grass.
- Equine Metabolic Syndrome Usually seen in overweight middle-aged native ponies in which the fat stores become metabolically active and result in insulin resistance and recurrent episodes of laminitis.
- **Equine Cushing's Disease** A disease of older horses and ponies in which an overgrowth of the pituitary gland results in overproduction of hormones that are thought to be responsible for the recurrent episodes of laminitis seen in sufferers.

Laminitis is characterised by lameness involving one or more feet which is often rapid in onset. Most often both front feet are affected, but hind feet can be involved as well.

Affected horses show a characteristic, pottery gait landing with the heel first. When at rest, most stand with their hind limbs under their body whilst leaning back to take the weight off their front feet. Generally digital pulses can be felt and most will also show a painful response to hoof testers.

Diagnosis of laminitis is made by clinical examination, blood tests and radiographs to formulate a treatment plan, which often involves working with your farrier.

Laminitis Radiography Package

Radiographs are a vital part of your horse's diagnosis and treatment. Regular radiographs are required to monitor your horse's laminitis as well as to support your farrier with the ongoing trimming and shoeing of your horse.
