


Bridget's Retirement

It all started with... a phone call from a Highland pub whilst warming up for Hogmanay 1988-89. I had spent 2 months as a locum at Wright and Morten in 1987 whilst Mike Spicer was recuperating from a slipped disc and during this time concluded that this was probably the best vet practice in the world. The team were friendly and involved me in all social activities, I was well supported when I asked for help and above all the farmers were (at least to my face!) remarkably accepting of the first female vet they had ever met. I loved the contrast between the Cheshire plains and the Peak District hills, I made my debut on the pipes at the Harrington Arms in Gawsworth and when Mike got better I didn't want to leave! There was a trip to New Zealand on the horizon which softened the blow.

Back to that Scottish pub- somehow a message from my parents reached me that I should phone Mr Morten in Macclesfield - so I did, immediately, from a noisy public phone, clutching a pint of heavy. "Do you want a job?" he said " Yes please" was the answer and it was concluded that the conversation should continue in a more sober atmosphere once festivities were finished.

32 years later I hope you'll agree that, whilst many changes have happened in the farming sector and in veterinary practice, we have upheld the practice traditions and values that I appreciated back in 1987. The practice has expanded and "Team Farm" now has more vets than there were in the whole practice in 1987, as well as our vet tech team.
